SCHOOL CREST

Enshrined within a lotus in full bloom, the School Crest represents the cult of devotion preached by Mahaprabhu Shri Vallabhacharya. The sacrificial fire at the centre of the Crest symbolises the Lord Himself (“Yagno Vai Vishnuh”). The three steps of the altar signifying Kshara, Akshara and Poorna Purushothama lead one to the Lord. At the foot of the altar is the Book of Divine Knowledge (the Vedas); the three flowers on it represent the factors conducive to the acquisition and propagation of Knowledge, Intelligence, Action and Material Resources. The School Motto “SATYAM PARAM DHEEMAHI”(May we meditate on the Supreme Truth) taken from Srimad Bhagavatam embodies the aim of all knowledge which is the realization of Supreme Truth. The School colours are Flaming Red and Sky Blue.

HISTORY

A munificent donation of Five hundred thousand rupees made to the Shri Vallabhacharya Vidya Sabha, Madras by the Philanthropic Dwaraka Doss brothers, the late Shri Jumna Doss and the late Shri Amichand Doss enabled it to found the Dwaraka Doss Goverdhan Doss Vaishnav College, Madras in June 1964. The phenomenal growth of this institution prompted the Sabha to think loudly of expanding its service to education at different levels. A Telugu businessman and great philanthropist, the late Shri Kola Perumal Chetty came forward with a generous donation of four hundred thousand rupees including a 21-ground land adjoining the College, for starting a first grade English School with modern techniques of teaching, blended perfectly with Hindu ethos and culture. The active involvement of the Sabha and the munificence of Chettigaru together triggered the starting of Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav School on 3 July 1972 with the blessings of His Holiness 108 Goswami Shri Brijratnalaji Maharaj. That day the school made a humble beginning by admitting students from LKG to V standard. Handsome donations periodically by Shri Kola Perumal Chetty totalled to more than a million rupees. This and the untiring efforts of the managing body resulted in a three storey building within a year of its inception, paving the way for the steady growth of the school over the years. In fact, the school came to be styled as Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav Senior Secondary School in 1978 with the opening of Plus Two, affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi. Spacious class rooms, good furniture, well equipped laboratories and workshops, excellent playgrounds and other amenities have made this institution enviable and most sought after by the parents and students alike.

The School imparts instruction in English medium. Tamil and Hindi are taught from Std. I onwards. Sanskrit is introduced from Std. V.

Realizing the difficulties of the tiny tots to reach the school, Shri Kola Perumal Chetty donated a school bus in 1974. Science and Library Block was constructed in 1977 to accommodate the laboratories, workshops and library. The top floor of the main building was built in 1979. To facilitate the smooth functioning of the school activities, an Open Air Theatre was commissioned in 1982. The office functioning in the first floor of the new administrative block built in 1984 was shifted to the ground floor in 2004 together with the Principal's office and the Correspondent's room. The Principal's room on the first floor was converted into Committee Meeting room. It was Shri Kola Perumal Chetty who was instrumental in starting a course in Computers in 1985. In 1986 a spacious canteen was added to provide hygienic snacks and drinks to appease the palate of the pupils.

In 1994-95 a new building to house the book stall, canteen. Sanchayika Bank, NCC room, three class rooms and the Computer lab was built. In May 2002 a lift was installed. It was inaugurated during the Tri-Decennial celebrations. A new school bus was bought in July 2002. Provision for rain water harvesting was made, bus and cycle sheds were built and paver blocks laid round the compound.

In 2003 - 2004, the administrative office was shifted to the ground floor and new air-conditioned rooms were provided. A spacious computer lab and maths lab were built on the second floor.

In 2005, the ADC Auditorium was rebuilt with two green rooms, one classroom and an audio-visual room. The staff room was extended and separate cabin for each teacher was provided. An arch with the school name was built at the main entrance. The school prayer hall was extended and air conditioned in May 2007. It provides a perfect ambience for daily prayer. The school gained ISO 9001 : 2000 certification in April 2005. It was upgraded to ISO 9001 : 2008 in April 2009. In 2007, Smart Class Programme was introduced for all classes and Plasma T.V.s were installed in all classes. The Basket Ball court was relaid and two floors were added to the Audio-Visual Block in the year 2008. A roof garden was set up on the terrace of the computer block.

In 2009 the school Library and KG Block were renovated and air conditioners were provided.

As per the CBSE instructions, the Continuous and Comprehensive Evaluation Scheme was implemented in the year 2010-2011 for classes I to X to provide holistic education.

In the year 2010 the Primary classes I - IV were renovated with false ceiling and tiled flooring. New furniture was provided. Light Roofing facility opposite to the ADC auditorium was also constructed.

The Centenary year celebration (17.02.1911 - 17.02.2011) of our Founder Chairman Late Shri Kola Perumal Chetty was organized in a grand manner on 17.02.2011.

GOALS

The school was founded by a Society deeply attached to Hindu religion and thought. It will, therefore, be the endeavour of the Management to maintain an atmosphere of intense devotion to Hindu religion in the campus even while inculcating in the wards, love and respect for other religions. The school, which derives its inspiration from Hindu Philosophy, Literature and Culture, tries to integrate these values with the cosmopolitan outlook of a good English Public School.

The Management and the teachers have set for themselves an ambitious goal of creating a strong younger generation with a sound mind in a sound body. They realized that a mere formal education is too deficient to achieve this end. To develop personality, leadership, high values and good habits in the students, the school lays stress on the following :

- i. to follow the guru-sishya tradition of yore.
- ii. to inculcate a sense of civic, social and moral responsibilities.
- iii. to develop leadership qualities.
- iv. to make the students realise the values of Indian Literature, History and Culture.
- v. to impart specialised Science and Commerce Education at + 2 level.

OUR VISION

We envision a global village where the students of Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav Senior Sec. School are the torch bearers of Educational, Physical, Spiritual and Cultural Excellence and the creators of Modern India.

SPECIAL FEATURES

1. **Intensive Academic Training** : Academic training starts on the very first day the school reopens. Slackness in studies and truancy from class work will be taken to the notice of parent or guardian as and when warranted. The cooperation of the parents / guardian is solicited in correcting their erring wards. The parents / guardian are advised to keep in touch with the Principal once a month. This collective effort of teachers, administrators and parents is what makes our school very special.
2. **Library** : Located in a spacious and imposing building, the library provides open access to a large collection of books acquired over the years. It has been remodelled with modern facilities - a separate cabin for the librarian, wall cupboards with glass doors, marbled floor, news bulletin boards, reading room for the staff and colourful plastic chairs for the students. It is fully airconditioned and provides perfect ambience for peaceful reading. The authorities encourage students to use the library to the maximum. The library is kept open after school hours and during term end holidays also.
3. **Sports and Games** : The school has Volley Ball and Badminton Courts. The students are encouraged to practise Yoga and play Table Tennis, Tennicoit, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi etc. Facilities for athletics are a plenty here. Drill and Physical Training are compulsory components of the curriculum. A new Basketball court was constructed at a huge cost during the year 2001 and it was inaugurated in 2002.
4. **School Publications** : The school publishes a calendar and diary which gives all the information needed by the students and parents. The campus journal 'Bal Brindavan', highlights the school activities. The annual school magazine 'Brindavan' carries articles by students and staff. From time to time souvenirs are published to commemorate special / significant occasions of the school.
5. **Gita Class** : Bhagavad Gita classes are conducted for the students of Std. V to XII every Thursday from 3.00 to 3.45 p.m. Students

having cent percent attendance receive a scholarship of ₹.100/- and those having 99% attendance receive a scholarship of ₹.50/-

6. **Hindi class :** Hindi classes are conducted for training the students for Dakshin Bharath Hindi Prachar Sabha Exams after school hours.
7. **Tamil class :** Tamil classes, (Std. V to VIII) for those students who do not know the language are held on Wednesdays and Fridays after school hours. These classes help the students to communicate and write in Tamil.
8. **Prayer :** The tone of the school is set by the Prayer which commences at 8.40 a.m. on all working days. An atmosphere of serenity prevails as the students recite slokas in praise of Lord Krishna. They invoke the blessings of Goddess Saraswathi and the Gurus. Slokas from the Gita and verses from Thirukkural also form a part of the daily prayer. This is followed by meditation which improves their mental alertness !
9. **Community Service :** The students are encouraged to actively participate in social and community work like Road Safety Patrol, Scouts & Guides, N.C.C., Cubs and Bulbuls and Career Guidance. NCC (VIII-IX), RSP (XI), Guides (VI - IX), Scouts (VI - VII). Cubs & Bulbuls (III - V) classes are held four times per month to train students in right social behaviour, discipline, citizenship, etc.
10. **Auditorium :** New ADC auditorium was rebuilt in 2005 with two green rooms and a class room.
11. **Canteen :** The canteen provides hygienic eatables at reasonable price during the lunch break.
12. **Accident Cover :** A personal accident insurance scheme is provided by M/s. Tata AIG Insurance for all students. Student (I to XII) pay a premium of ₹.130/- annually and become a member of this scheme. This scheme has been introduced from 2004-2005 onwards. This is obligatory.
13. **Medical Facilities :** The school runs a first aid cell. Annual medical check-up, done by qualified doctors, is a must for every student.

14. **Parent Teacher Association** : An active PTA meets yearly twice to discuss the various problems faced by them. But its executive body meets more frequently to discuss the issues connected with the school.
15. **Alumni Association** : The old students of the school are welcome to visit the school and join the annual get together on January 26. They have to get enrolled as life members on payment of ₹.100/
16. **Kalasarovar** : This Inter School Cultural Meet is an annual feature of the School. It is sponsored by well - wishers.
17. **Summer Coaching Camp** : Encouraged by the overwhelming response and success of the Summer Coaching camp started in May `93, the school has made it a regular feature. This two week course stresses on physical fitness and gives coaching in games like Table Tennis, Badminton, Volleyball, Basketball, Cricket, Athletics, Chess, Carrom. Art and Craft classes are also conducted.
18. **Shri Vallabh Cultural Academy** : To promote and nurture Indian art and culture and also to provide more opportunities to develop their innate talents and to impress upon young minds the significance of Indian heritage, values and virtues, art and culture, we are conducting the following classes under the name of Shri Vallabh Cultural Academy.

Classes are conducted for the following disciplines : Vocal, Dance, Guitar, Violin, Veena, Mridangam, Tabla, Flute, Yoga and the key board.

Students of classes V to VIII attend any one of the above disciplines after taking an aptitude test. The classes are conducted on Mondays and Wednesdays from 2.20 p.m to 3.45 p.m.
19. **Career Guidance** : There is a Career Guidance cell which arranges lectures by experts in different fields for our senior students.

20. **Computer Classes** : Computer Science forms a part of the curriculum for classes I to X. We have well-equipped computer lab. The school is hooked to Internet. The school has its own Website. Do visit us at www.kpcvs.in. You can also send your views at kolaperumal@dataone.in.
21. **Maths Lab** : In keeping with the CBSE's directive, a Maths Lab was set up in 2004-2005. There are provisions for enriching the ability and creativity of the students.
22. **Abacus Classes** : Abacus, an internationally well known powerful mental development programme has been included in the Maths syllabus and it is really helpful for the students.
23. **Tour** : Travel helps to broaden one's outlook. To promote the all round development of the students of Std. 22. **Abacus Classes** : Abacus, an internationally well known powerful mental development programme has been included in the Maths syllabus and it is really helpful for the students.
23. **Tour** : Travel helps to broaden one's outlook. To promote the all round development of the students of Std. IX to XII, tours to places of historical, geographical, mythological and religious importance are arranged every year in lieu of their field trips. The Staff Council finalises the places and schedule during the academic year. The cost of the tour is collected in instalments with the term fees. Our school remains one of the pioneers in introducing the Plasma TV classes. These classes were introduced during the academic year 2007-08 from LKG to Std. XII. Such technology is helping in enhancing class room teaching and making teaching - learning process effective and interesting.
28. **Scholarship for Gita Recitation** : The Management of the school will grant full fee concession to students who are able to recite from memory all the 18 chapters of the Gita.
29. **Shri Vallabh Band Troupe** : To commemorate the Silver Jubilee year, the school formed the 'Shri Vallabha Band Troupe'. The students of Std. V to VIII receive intensive training in playing the flute, trumpet, clarinet and drums. The training is given by experienced persons. In the year 2001 an interschool Band Competition was introduced -the first of its kind. Three Rolling Shields for the first three places were instituted. This competition is a yearly feature.
30. **Book Stall** : The school has a well equipped Book Stall which supplies books and stationery to the students as per their requirements. This is beneficial to both students and parents.
31. **Philately Club** : The world of stamps fascinates most children. Seeing the avid interest of our students, a Philately Club was started in the academic year 1999 - 2000. Students of Std. V to Std. VIII have become members of the Philately Club. These members are eligible to receive the latest stamps being issued by the Postal Department. The overwhelming response of the students has been quite heartening. The first inter-school Philately exhibition was held in 2002 and then in 2006 during the project 'Know your State' - TN Exhibition.
32. **School Bus** : The school has a 40 seater Swaraj Mazda bus and a 25 seater mini bus to provide easy and safe transport to the young students living at a distance from the school.

33. **Kola Perumal Chetty Sports Academy** : The year 2003 saw the birth of the Kola Perumal Chetty Sports Academy. This academy works after school hours from 3.00 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. Budding sports persons are given intensive coaching in the games of their choice.
34. **Get Well Room** : The pleasant atmosphere of the Get Well Room helps the sick students to recuperate fast.
35. **Health Club** : This club is taking great initiative in creating awareness among students of the need to maintain good health. Speeches, lectures, competitions and food festivals are organized at regular intervals.
36. **Disaster Management Cell** : The school has a ‘Disaster Management Cell’ to train students to cope up with disaster and lend a helping hand when the situation demands it.
37. **Counselling Unit** : The school has a “Counselling Unit” which helps both students and parents to discuss problems faced by their wards and try to find solutions. Parents can meet the counsellor on Monday and Thursday evenings after school hours.
38. **Students Consumer Club** : The school formed the ‘Consumer Club’ in August 2006. The main aim of the club is to educate children about the rights of the consumers as provided in the consumer Protection Act 1986 and to strengthen the consumer movement in the country. The club comprises of students of std.IX. There is a teacher co-ordinator who guides the students.
39. **National Green Corps** : The school is a member of National Green Corps. The main objective of the NGC is to bring children into direct contact with environmental problems faced by the society they live in and make them think of solutions. NGC unit celebrates Van Mahotsav, Wildlife Week, International Ozone Day, Human Rights Day, World Day for Water, etc.
40. **Roof Garden** : As per the guidance of the Confederation of Indian Industry, the school set up a beautiful Roof Garden in the year 2008. There are 428 varieties of plants which enhance the beauty of the surroundings.

41. **Personality Development Class** : These classes are conducted for students of class IX by Alma Mater, an organization which helps to maximise and actualise individual potential.
42. **NISM** : The school introduced the Financial Literacy Programme for senior students in the year 2009. This programme, developed by National Institute of Securities Market, Mumbai is organized by Madras Stock Exchange.
43. **EZ Vidya** : The school has adopted EZVIDYA curriculum for Computer Science for classes I to VIII.
44. **In touch with Parents** : The school is conveying messages to all parents through SMS using NEVERSKIP. This facility enables the parents to know the day to day activities of the school.

HOUSE SYSTEM

“Teach them young”, goes the adage. In order to develop leadership qualities and shape their personalities, the students from standard I - XII are divided into four houses. Raman, Shivaji, Tagore and Vivekananda, with house colours : green, blue, red and yellow. Each house guided by able teachers, forms a cohesive group but vies with the others in winning laurels.

Each house, in turn, is assigned a week-long responsibility of conducting the morning assembly, preparation of news reports, talks on spiritual and general topics, pulling up late-comers and those that flout uniform regulations, ensuring discipline, smooth movement of students to their class rooms, checking furniture, maintenance of black boards, conducting school functions and overall supervision of any activity that is connected with the school. Besides, a contemporary theme is also highlighted every week by charts, posters, talks etc.

The competitive spirit among the houses is keen but healthy. The performance of each house is assessed and points are awarded. The best house gets the rolling shield.

CURRICULUM

LANGUAGES : First Language (English) is compulsory for all Standards. Second Language - Tamil / Hindi (I - V) and Tamil / Hindi / Sanskrit(VI - X) is compulsory. Third Language (Sanskrit/Hindi/Tamil) is compulsory for V - VIII.

The students can choose either Sanskrit or Hindi (if Tamil is chosen as second language), Sanskrit or Tamil (if Hindi is opted as second language).

ROAD SAFETY PATROL

RSP Students (Std XI) should wear the following uniform on the days when they have RSP classes.

Boys : White pants, white shirt with shoulder flap on both the sides, double pocket in front with flap ; black canvas shoes and brown socks.

Girls: White salwar, white kameez and white dupatta ; black canvas shoes and brown socks.

ADMISSION

1. The school is co-educational admitting both boys and girls to all standards without consideration of caste, creed, community or social status.
2. The students seeking admission can collect the application form from the school office. Such forms, filled in by the parents/ guardians, must be submitted for registration together with the necessary certificates before the due date. The applicant is given a test and based on the performance, he/she is admitted to the standard found fit.
3. Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. Principal can refuse admission to an applicant without assigning any reason whatsoever.
4. Applicants from recognised schools must produce transfer, conduct or any other certificate required by the school. These certificates must be countersigned by the Inspector of Schools if they had been issued by schools situated in states other than Tamilnadu. Students of CBSE schools should get the counter signature of the CBSE Dy. Secy. Chennai in their TC's.
5. A student offering any of the 3 languages viz, Hindi / Tamil / Sanskrit in Std. IX should have studied the same upto Std. VIII.

ADMISSION (XI Standard)

1. Candidates seeking admission to the XI standard must have passed the X standard of the All India Secondary School Examination or Matriculation of Statutory Universities or the SSC Examination of any State Board of Secondary Education.
2. The candidates must have undergone 10 years of formal education in an English Medium School to become eligible for admission.

3. Minimum age prescribed for admission to the XI standard 15 years 6 months as on 1st June of the year in which admission is sought. This may be relaxed in special cases by the Chairman, CBSE, New Delhi.
4. Those seeking Science group must have secured 60% marks in Science and Maths and those seeking Commerce group must have secured 50% besides opting for English as a core subject.
5. The selected candidates should produce the following certificates in original at the time of admission.
 - i. Transfer Certificate
 - ii. Conduct certificate
 - iii. Mark List of the last Examination passed i.e. X Std.
 - iv. Pass Certificate from the Board / University.
 - v. Community Certificate.

WORKING DAYS AND PERIODS

1. The academic year for std I to X is divided into two Terms.

2. The school works on all days except second and fourth Saturdays, Sundays and holidays declared by the Institution or Government. However, Classes I to V will not work on Saturdays. If necessary, classes may be held on some of these days also.
3. The school starts functioning at 8.30 a.m.

The working day consists of Eight periods with a lunch break from 12.30 to 1.00 p.m. Students are required to be in the campus at 8.30 a.m. before the commencement of the prayer.

4. Coming late to the school is a serious breach of discipline. Such late comers are likely to be sent home. If this recurs, the student is imposed a fine of ₹.5/-

GENERAL RULES

1. The parents are required to send the school diary without fail through their wards. They are free to communicate with the school through this book.
2. Parents are not permitted to meet the teachers directly. They may do so with the written permission from the Principal.
3. The school discourages private coaching. However the Principal may arrange such coaching in special cases.
4. Slackness in attendance, habitual late coming, indifference to home work, disobedience and disrespect towards staff and such other offences entail dismissal from the school.
5. Students suffering from contagious diseases like mumps or measles / chicken pox must stay away from school during the quarantine period (21 days).
6. Mobile phones not to be used in the school premises.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE RULES

1. Attendance is taken every session (morning and afternoon) by the class teacher. It is obligatory on the part of the student to attend all the periods prescribed for the day.

2. A student is required to attend the school on all the working days. If it becomes necessary to take leave, he/she has to submit a leave letter, to the class teacher before availing the leave. If the student cannot submit the leave letter for genuine reasons before going on leave, he/she may do so on return to the school.
3. Students abstaining from school for more than three days have to submit an explanatory letter written by the parent / guardian.
4. Leave on medical grounds should be supported by a proper medical certificate.
5. The school monitors the student's attendance periodically. Parent/guardian are informed if their wards lag behind in attendance. They are requested to take corrective steps in such cases.

DISCIPLINARY RULES

1. Students of the School are strictly forbidden to participate in political agitations of all kinds. If a student attends a political meeting or engages in political agitation and conducts himself in a way that is detrimental to the corporate life or functioning of the school, the Principal is empowered to expel or suspend such a student.
2. Students are strictly forbidden to loiter in the verandahs.
3. Smoking, consuming drugs, littering, defacing the walls, ragging, use of offensive language and such other uncivilized behaviour entail severe punishment.
4. Students are not allowed to address any authority in a body, as such combined action is not conducive to good order.
5. Consumption of non-vegetarian food in the campus is strictly forbidden. Any student violating this rule will be summarily expelled from the school.

II For classes XI & XII

- a) The school conducts three Mid Terms (one per term), two Terminals and one annual Examination every year. Attendance in these examinations and tests including orals and practicals is compulsory. The Terminal Examinations play a vital role in preparing XII students for the Board exams.
 - b) It is necessary that each student passes atleast three times in all the examinations conducted in that subject to become eligible for promotion.
 - c) Promotion is computed in the following manner - 40% for the two Terminal examinations (20% each); 20% for three mid terms and 40% for Annual examinations. This weightage not only gives fair and even assessment of the students performance but also provides an opportunity for improvement if the student lags behind in the earlier examinations / tests.
- III The school sends reports on students' performance to their parents / guardian periodically. They are requested to scan them carefully and, if need be meet the Principal to discuss remedial measures.**

IV Tests and examinations are not conducted again for absentees.

WITHDRAWAL

1. Applications for T.C. must be given in writing by the parent / guardian, in case of need, before February 28 of every year with ₹.100/- in the school office. The T.C. is made ready after the results of that year are announced. It should be collected before April 10 failing which, the application for T.C. gets lapsed. Applications for issue of T.C. received after the announcement of the results will be entertained only after the payment of Tuition Fee, Special fee and Stationery fee of I Term.
2. If the applications are made after February 28, the T.C. will be issued one week after the school reopens, i.e., in June.
3. In case where the T.C. is applied after one or more years after leaving the school, a search fee for ₹.200/- will be collected.
4. Duplicate T.C's are not normally issued. However, the Principal reserves the right to issue one if convinced of the genuineness of the case. ₹.200/- is levied in such cases.
5. In case the parent gets transferred, issue of T.C. is favourably considered even at a later date provided a copy of the transfer order is produced.

BUS, RAIL CONCESSION FORMS AND CERTIFICATES

Application for availing of railway concession must be made before March 5 of every year. This facility can only be availed of, to join parents / guardian at the address registered in the School and for return journey.
