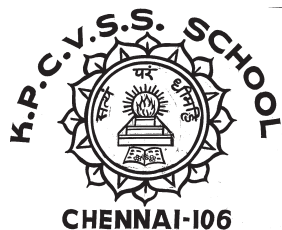

SCHOOL CREST



Enshrined within a lotus in full bloom, the School Crest represents the cult of devotion preached by Mahaprabhu Shri Vallabhacharya. The sacrificial fire at the centre of the Crest symbolises the Lord Himself (“Yagno Vai Vishnuh”). The three steps of the altar signifying **Kshara, Akshara and**

Poorna Purushothama lead one to the Lord. At the foot of the altar is the Book of Divine Knowledge (the Vedas); the three flowers on it represent the factors conducive to the acquisition and propagation of Knowledge, Intelligence, Action and Material Resources. The School Motto “SATYAM PARAM DHEEMAHI”: (May we meditate on the Supreme Truth) taken from Srimad Bhagavatam embodies the aim of all knowledge which is the realization of Supreme Truth. The School colours are Flaming Red and Sky Blue.

HISTORY

A munificent donation of Five hundred thousand rupees made to the Shri Vallabhacharya Vidya Sabha, Madras by the philanthropic Dwaraka Doss brothers, the late Shri Jumna Doss and the late Shri Amichand Doss enabled it to found the Dwaraka Doss Goverdhan Doss Vaishnav College, Madras in June 1964. The phenomenal growth of this institution prompted the Sabha to think loudly of expanding its service to education at different levels. A Telugu businessman and great philanthropist, the late Shri Kola Perumal Chetty came forward with a generous donation of four hundred thousand rupees, including a 21-ground land adjoining the College, for starting a first grade English School with modern techniques of teaching, blended perfectly with Hindu ethos and culture. The active involvement of the Sabha and the munificence of Chettigaru together triggered the starting of Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav School on 3 July 1972 with the blessings of His Holiness 108 Goswami Shri Brijratnalalji Maharaj. That day the school made a humble beginning by admitting students from LKG to V standard. Handsome donations periodically by Shri Kola Perumal Chetty totalled to more than a million rupees. This and the untiring efforts of the Managing body resulted in a three storey building within a year of its inception, paving the way for the steady growth of the school over the years. In fact, the school came to be styled as Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav Senior Secondary School in 1978 with the opening of Plus Two, affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi. Spacious class rooms, good furniture, well equipped laboratories and workshops, excellent playgrounds and other amenities has made this Institution enviable and most sought after by the parents and students alike.

Realizing the difficulties of the tiny tots to reach the school,

Shri Kola Perumal Chetty donated a school bus in 1974. Science and Library Block was constructed in 1977 to accommodate the laboratories, workshops and library. The top floor of the main building was built in 1979. To facilitate the smooth functioning of the school activities, an Open Air Theatre was commissioned in 1982. The office functioning in the first floor of the new administrative block built in 1984 was shifted to the ground floor in 2004 together with the Principal's office and the Correspondent's room. The Principal's room on the first floor was converted to the Committee Members' room. It was Shri Kola Perumal Chetty who was instrumental in starting a course in Computers in 1985. In 1986 a spacious canteen was added to provide hygienic snacks and drinks to appease the palate of the pupils.

In 1994-95 a new building to house the book stall, canteen, Sanchaika Bank, NCC Room, three class rooms and the Computer lab was built. In May 2002 a lift was installed. It was inaugurated during the Tri-Decennial celebrations. A new school bus was bought in July 2002. Means of rain water harvesting, bus and cycle sheds were built and paver blocks laid round the compound.

The School, affiliated to CBSE, imparts instruction in English medium only. Tamil and Hindi are taught from Std. I onwards. Sanskrit is introduced from Std. V.

In 2003-2004, the administrative office was shifted to the ground floor and new air-conditioned rooms were provided. A spacious computer lab and maths lab were built on the second floor.

In 2005, the ADC Auditorium was rebuilt with two green rooms, one classroom and an audio-visual room. The staff room was extended and separate cabins for each teacher were provided. An arch with the school name was built at the main entrance. The school gained ISO 9001:2000 certification in April 2005. It was upgraded to ISO 9001:2008 in April 2009.

In 2007, Smart Class Programme was introduced for all classes and Plasma T.V.s were installed in all classes. The Basket Ball court was relaid and two floors were added to the Audio-Visual Block in the year 2008. A roof garden was set up on the terrace of the computer block.

GOALS

The school was founded by a Society deeply attached to Hindu religion and thought. It will, therefore, be the endeavour of the Management to maintain an atmosphere of intense devotion to Hindu religion in the campus even while inculcating in the wards, love and respect for other religions. The school, which derives its inspiration from Hindu Philosophy, Literature and Culture, tries to integrate these values with the cosmopolitan outlook of a good English Public School.

The Management and the teachers have set for themselves an ambitious goal of creating a strong younger generation with a sound mind in a sound body. They realized that a mere formal education is too deficient to achieve this end. To develop personality, leadership, high values and good habits in the students, the school lays stress on the following :

- i. to follow the guru-sishya tradition of yore,
- ii. to inculcate a sense of civic, social and moral responsibilities,
- iii. to develop leadership qualities,
- iv. to make the student realise the values of Indian Literature, History and Culture.
- v. to impart specialised Science Education at +2 level.

OUR VISION

We envision a global village where the students of Kola Perumal Chetty Vaishnav Senior Sec. School are the torch bearers of Educational, Physical, Spiritual and Cultural Excellence and the creators of Modern India.

SPECIAL FEATURES

1. Intensive Academic Training : Academic training starts on the very first day the school reopens. Slackness in studies and truancy from class work will be taken to the notice of parents or guardians as and when warranted. The cooperation of the parents/guardians is solicited in correcting their erring wards. The parents/guardians are advised to keep in touch with the Principal once a month. This collective effort of teachers, administrators and parents is what makes our school very special.

2. Library : Located in a spacious and lovely building, the library provides open access to a large collection of books acquired over the years. It had been remodelled and renovated with modern facilities. New marbled floor was laid and a false roof had been provided. Additional fans and tubelights were fixed. Wall cupboards with glass doors were added for keeping more number of books. In the academic year 2003-2004, a computer was added. All the data regarding acquisition and catalogue has been fed into it.

A separate cabin for the Librarian with glass doors, reading room for the staff and colourful plastic chairs for the students have been provided. Newspaper reading stand and News bulletin boards are also provided for displaying current information. The atmosphere and facilities are conducive for quiet and serious study. The authorities encourage students to use this facility to greater advantage by providing library periods and selecting books for them. The library is kept open after school hours and during term end holidays also.

3. Sports and Games : The school has Cricket and Foot Ball fields, Volley Ball and Badminton Courts. The students are encouraged to practise Yoga and play Table Tennis, Tennis, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi etc. Facilities for athletics are a plenty here. Drill and Physical Training are compulsory components of the curriculum. A new Basketball court was constructed at

a huge cost during the year 2001 and it was inaugurated in 2002.

4. School Publications : The school publishes a calendar and diary which gives all the information needed by the students and parents. Campus journal 'Bal Brindavan', highlights the school activities. The annual school magazine 'Brindavan' carries articles by students and staff. In the academic year 2003-2004 a sports souvenir was published. This souvenir contains information of the previous 31 Sports Meet - the Guests, the Champions and the endowments.

5. Gita Class : Bhagavad Gita classes are conducted for the students of Std. V to XII on every Thursday from 3.45 to 4.30 p.m. Students having cent percent attendance will receive a scholarship of Rs.100/- and those having 99% attendance will receive a scholarship of Rs.50/-.

6. Hindi class : Hindi classes are conducted for training the students for Dakshin Bharath Hindi Prachara Sabha Exams after school hours.

7. Tamil class : Tamil classes, (Std. V to VIII) for those students who do not know the language, are held on Wednesdays and Fridays after school hours. These classes help the students to communicate and write in Tamil.

8. Prayer : The tone of the School is set by the Prayer which commences at 8.35 a.m. on all working days. An atmosphere of serenity prevails as the students recite slokas in praise of Lord Krishna. They invoke the blessings of Goddess Saraswathi and the Gurus. Slokas from the Gita and verses from Thirukkural also form a part of the daily prayer. This is followed by meditation which improves their mental alertness!

9. Community Service : The students are encouraged to actively participate in social and community work like Road Safety Patrol, Scouts & Guides, N.C.C., Cubs and Bulbuls and Career Guidance. NCC (Cl.VIII-IX), RSP (Cl. XI), Guides (Cl.VI-IX), Scouts (Cl.VI-VII), Cubs & Bulbuls (Cl.III-V) classes are

held four times per month to train students in right social behaviour, discipline, citizenship, etc.

10. Auditorium : New ADC auditorium was rebuilt in 2005 with two green rooms and a class room.

11. Canteen : The canteen provides hygienic eatables at reasonable price during the lunch break.

12. Accident Cover : A personal accident insurance scheme is provided by M/s. Tata AIG Insurance for all students. Students (I to XII) pay a premium of Rs.130/- annually and become a member of this scheme. This scheme has been introduced from 2004-2005 onwards. This is obligatory.

13. Medical Facilities : The school runs a first aid cell. Annual medical check-up, done by qualified doctors, is a must for every student.

14. Parent Teacher Association : An active PTA meets yearly twice to discuss the various problems faced by them. But its executive body meets more frequently to discuss the issues connected with the school.

15. Alumni Association : The old students of the school are welcome to visit the school and join the annual get-together on January 26. They have to get enrolled as life members on payment of Rs.100/-.

16. Kalasarovar : This Inter-School Cultural Meet is an annual feature of the School. It is sponsored by well-wishers.

17. Summer Coaching Camp : Encouraged by the overwhelming response and success of the Summer Coaching Camp started in May '93, the school has made it a regular feature. This two week course stresses on physical fitness and gives coaching in games like Table Tennis, Badminton, Volleyball, Basketball, Cricket, Tennis etc. Summer Craft classes are also conducted.

18. Shri Vallabh Cultural Academy : To promote and nurture Indian art and culture and also to provide more

opportunities to develop their innate talents and to impress upon young minds the significance of Indian heritage, values and virtues, art and culture, we are conducting the following classes under the name of Shri Vallabh Cultural Academy. The Director of the Academy takes care of the cultural values to be inculcated, motivates and guides the children.

Classes are conducted for the following disciplines :

Vocal, Dance, Guitar, Violin, Veena, Mridangam, Tabla, Flute and Yoga. The key board was introduced in the year 2003-2004.

Students of classes V to VIII attend any one of the above disciplines after taking an aptitude test. The classes are conducted on Mondays and Wednesdays between 2.25 and 4.00 p.m. A fee of Rs.250/- is collected per term. For any clarification contact :

19. Career guidance: There is a career guidance and counselling cell which arranges lectures by experts in different fields for our senior students.

20. Computer classes : In order to prepare our students for the new era, computer science forms a part of the curriculum for classes I to X. We have a well-equipped computer lab and have plans to upgrade it further for the coming academic year. The school is hooked to Internet. The school has its own Website. Do visit us at WWW.kpcvs.in. 21. Maths Lab : In keeping with the CBSE's directive, a Math Lab was set up in 2004-2005. There are provisions for enriching the ability and creativity of the students.

22. Abacus Classes : Abacus an internationally well known powerful mental development programme has been included in the Maths syllabus and it is really helpful for the students.

23. Tour : Travel helps to broaden one's outlook. To promote the all round development of the students of Std. IX to XII tours to places of historical, geographical, mythological and

religious importance are arranged every year in lieu of their field trips. The Staff Council finalises the place and schedule during the academic year. The cost of the tour is collected in instalments with the term fees. Any student applying for T.C. in the middle of the academic year should pay the whole amount before clearance.

24. Indoor Games Hall : A spacious hall is provided for the students to practise indoor games like Table Tennis, Carrom, Chess etc.

25. Papyrus Club: An online newspaper was launched by the students of Std.VI to VIII on 26 November 2007. It is part of the Deccan Chronicle Publications. The magazine named Kola Chatter is a monthly publication. The latest news and views of the school will be available on the net. Log on to www.papyrusclub.com to view it.

26. Sri Vallabha Samskrta Vidya Pitham : To propagate and keep alive our rich, ancient language, free classes are held in Sanskrit on all Sundays and second Saturdays to enable Sanskrit lovers to learn the language. Students are prepared to appear for the Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan Exams. The classes are open to all those who are willing to learn.

27. Art Education & Co-curricular Activities: Literary Associations, Music, Arts & Crafts, Science, Computer Science, Gardening, Veda, Sports and Interact Club promote interesting co-curricular activities. Besides these, film-shows and educational tours to places of importance are also arranged under expert guidance.

28. Smart Class - Visual Education : BEAMS - A multimedia complex was built in December 2003. Visual education is provided through K-Yan, T.V., V.C.P. Film Projector and Smart Class. **Our School remains one of the pioneers in introducing the Plasma TV classes.** These classes were introduced during the academic year 2007-08 from LKG to Std. XII. Such technology is helping in enhancing class room teaching and making teaching - learning process effective and interesting.

29. Scholarship for Gita Recitation : The Management of the school will grant 'full fee concession' to students who are able to recite from memory all the 18 chapters of the Gita.

30. Shri Vallabh Band Troupe : To commemorate the Silver Jubilee year, the school has formed the 'Shri Vallabha Band Troupe'. The students of Std. V to VIII receive intensive training in playing the flute, trumpet, clarinet and drums. The training is given by experienced persons. In the year 2001 an inter-school Band Competition was introduced, the first of its kind. Three Rolling Shields for the first three places were instituted. This competition is a yearly feature.

31. Sanchayika Bank : To inculcate the habit of saving in students, the school has a 'Sanchayika Bank'.

32. Book Stall : The school has a well equipped Book Stall which supplies books and stationery to the students as per their requirements. This is beneficial to both, students and parents.

33. Philately Club : The world of stamps fascinates most children. Seeing the avid interest of our students, a Philately Club was started in the academic year 1999-2000. Students of Std. V to Std. VIII have become members of the 'Philately Club'. These members are eligible to receive the latest stamps being issued by the Postal Department. The overwhelming response of the students has been quite heartening. The first inter-school Philately exhibition was held in 2002 and in 2006 during the project 'Know your State' TN exhibition.

34. School Bus : The school has a 40 seater Swaraj Mazda bus and a 25 seater mini bus to provide easy and safe transport to the young students living at a distance from the school.

35. Kola Perumal Chetty Sports Academy : The year 2003 saw the birth of the Kola Perumal Chetty Sports Academy. This academy works after school hours from 3.45 pm to 4.45 pm. Budding sports persons are given intensive coaching in the games of their choice.

36. Get Well Room : The pleasant atmosphere of the Get Well Room helps the sick students recuperate fast.

37. Health Club : This club is taking great initiative in creating awareness among students of the need to maintain good health. Speeches, lectures, competitions and food festivals are organised at regular intervals.

38. Disaster Management Cell : The school has a "Disaster Management Cell" to train students to cope up with disaster and lend a helping hand when the situation demands it.

39. Counselling Unit : The school has a "Counselling Unit" which helps both students and parents to discuss problems faced by their wards and try to find solutions. Parents can meet the counsellor on Monday and Thursday evenings after school hours.

40. Students Consumer Club : The school formed the 'Consumer Club' in August 2006. The main aim of the club is to educate children about the rights of the consumers as provided in the Consumer Protection Act 1986 and to strengthen the consumer movement in the country. The club comprises of students of Std. IX. There is a teacher coordinator who guides the students.

41. National Green Corps : The school is a member of National Green Corps. The main objective of the NGC's is to bring children into direct contact with environmental problems facing the society they live in and make them think of solutions. NGC unit celebrates Van Mahotsav, Wildlife Week, International Ozone Day, Human Rights Day, World Day for Water, etc.

42. Green I Project : The school was declared the **National Winners** at the "Green I" competition from among 100 premier schools in the country. The competition organised by the Confederation of Indian Industries Yi, Carrier and Green Building Council on September 24, 2008 was held at Mumbai.

The competition aimed at encouraging students to think about conservation and to instill environmental awareness among school children.

"GREENERY GENERATES LIFE, SO LET US GENERATE GREENERY". The project adopted by the school aims at creating environmental friendly atmosphere in the school with the prize money of rupees seven and half lakhs, which will inculcate in the students the need to preserve our environment. Eight rain water harvesting system, a roof garden, organic fertilization through encouraging nesting of birds, encouragement of zero garbage etc. form a part of the project.

43. The school prayer hall was extended and air-conditioned in May 2007. It provides a perfect ambience for daily prayer.

HOUSE SYSTEM

'*Teach them young*' goes the adage. In order to develop leadership qualities and a total personality in students, the school introduced the house system. In this system, the Principal assigns various responsible positions to students like School Pupil Leader, House Captains, Prefects and Games Captains. These leaders help in carrying out the various school activities. In fact, they run the school on their own on Teachers' Day (Sept. 5). That is perhaps one reason why they command a great deal of respect from their fellow-students and teachers.

The school, from I to XII standard, is divided into four houses: Raman, Shivaji, Tagore and Vivekananda. They are also given, in that order, house colours: green, blue, red and yellow. Each house, guided by able teachers forms a cohesive group but vies with the others in winning laurels.

Each house, in turn, is assigned a week-long responsibility of conducting the morning assembly, preparation of news reports, talks on spiritual and general topics, pulling up late-comers and those that flout uniform regulations, ensuring discipline,

smooth movement of students to their class rooms, checking furniture, maintenance of black boards, conducting school functions and overall supervision of any activity that is connected with the school. Besides, a contemporary theme is also highlighted every week by charts, posters, talks etc.

The competitive spirit among the houses is keen but healthy. The performance of each house is assessed and points are awarded. The best house gets the rolling shield.

CURRICULUM

LANGUAGES : First Language (English) is compulsory for all Standards. Second Language (Tamil or Hindi) is compulsory for all Standards. Third Language (Sanskrit or Hindi or Tamil) is compulsory for V, VI, VII and VIII Standards only.

The students can choose either Sanskrit or Hindi (if Tamil is chosen as second language), Sanskrit or Tamil (if Hindi is opted as second language).
